Who We Are

Infection Prevention and Control (IPAC) Foundation is a non-profit organization that aims at building a strong defense system against infectious diseases in Pakistan. IPAC Foundation is working for a paradigm shift in the healthcare sector and aims to play the role of a leader in preventive health. Our mission is to reduce the burden of infectious and communicable diseases in Pakistan through capacity building of healthcare providers, and by educating people about preventive and precautionary mechanisms. We strive to break the chain of infection transmissions through early diagnosis and proper treatment.

Foundation History

A group of Pakistani doctors from North America and medical students from Pakistan got together to create a mass movement and spread awareness regarding Hepatitis B and C in Pakistan. On August 6, 2016, Volunteer Force against Hepatitis Transmission (VFAHT) was founded at the CM Secretariat, Punjab with only 100 volunteers. But soon the board realizes awareness wasn't enough to cater the burden of infectious diseases, so they established a non-profit organization titled Infection Prevention and Control Foundation (Corporate ID no is 0150064) in 2020 to expand its horizons and increase its operation and services.

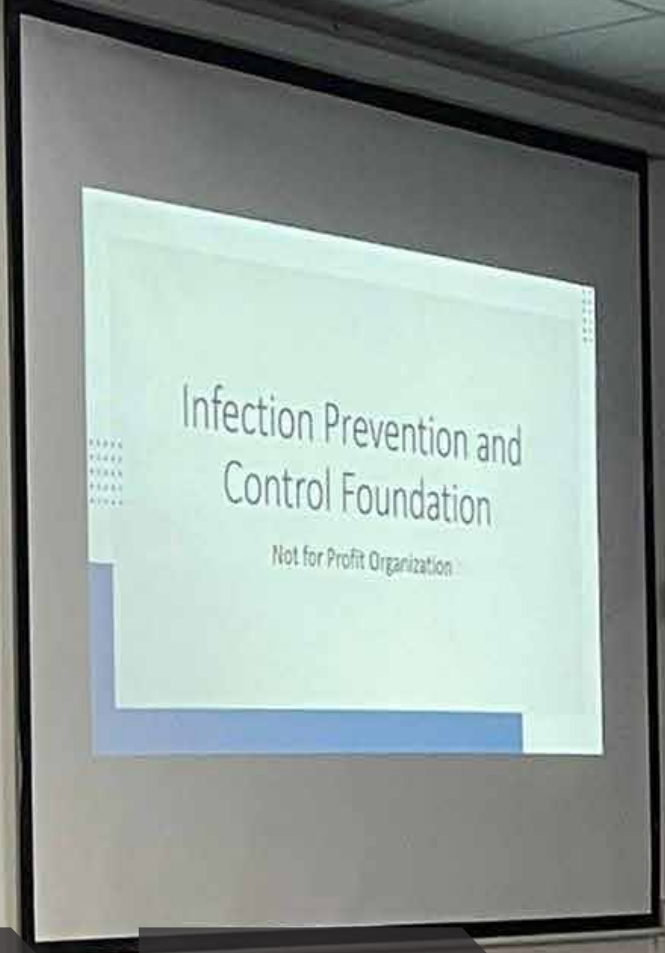

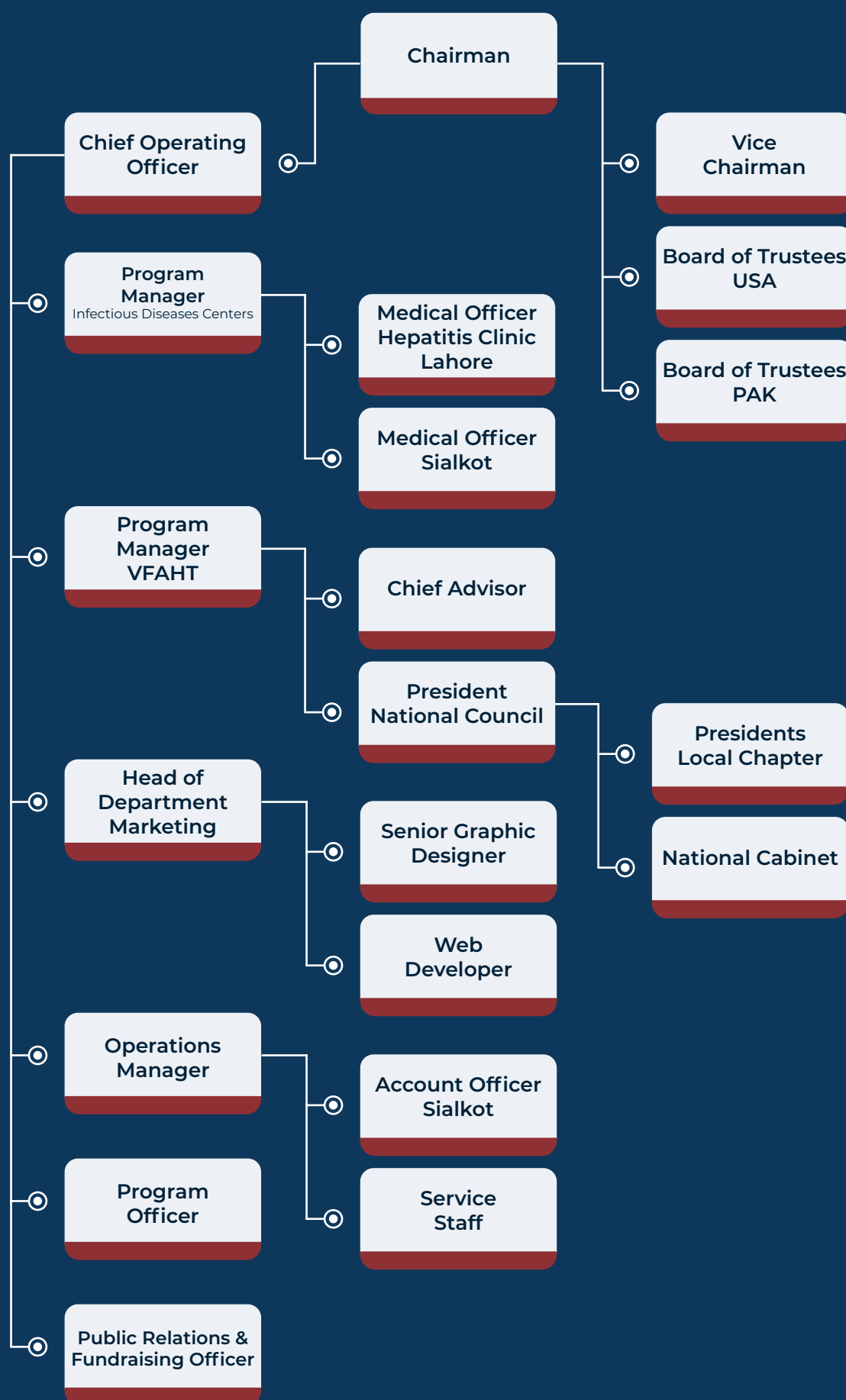

- Inculcate a sense of moral responsibility among future generations targeting students, parents and teachers to towards infection prevention and control.

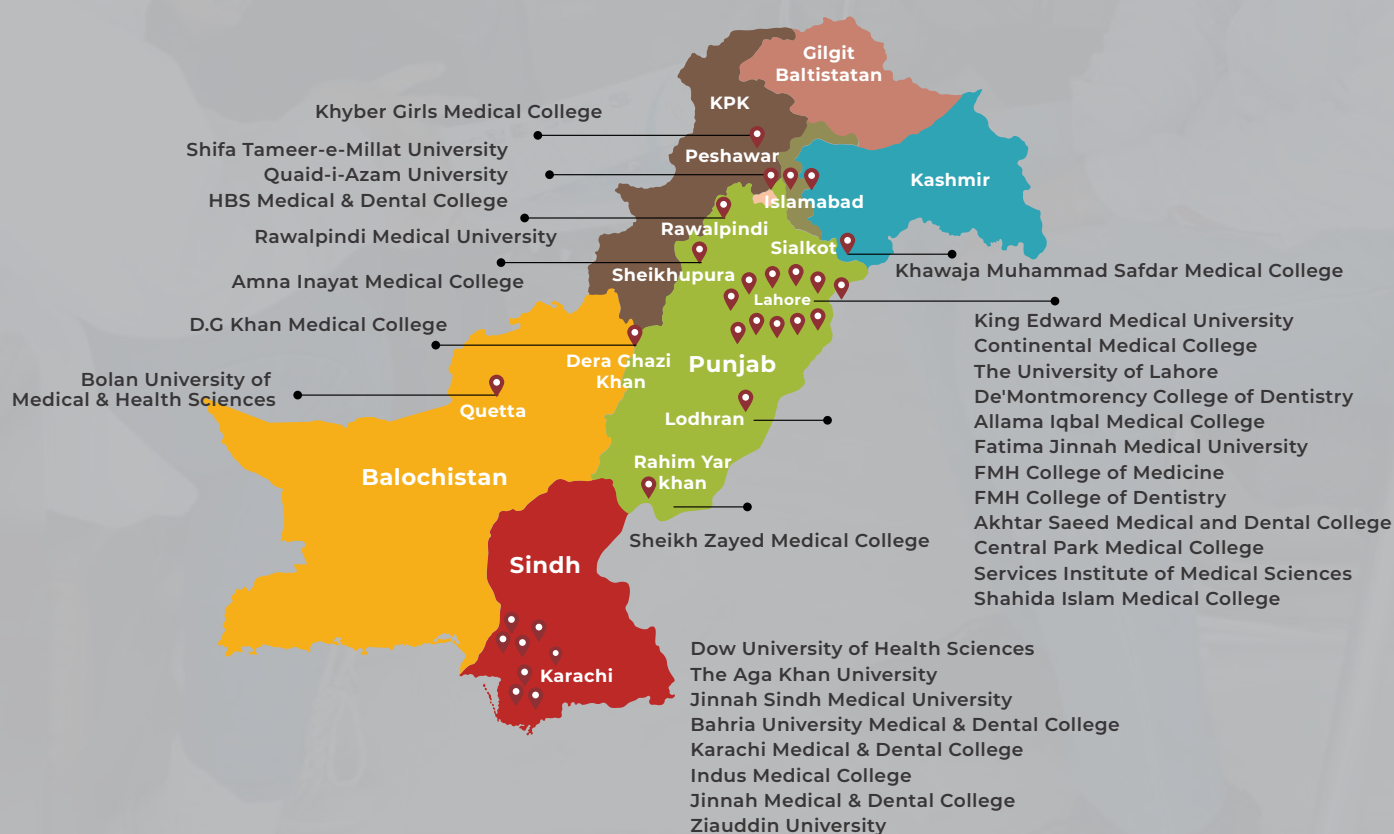

Community Health Program

Pakistan has been prone to healthcare problems for decades. The spread rate of infectious diseases is higher in Pakistan as compared to other developing countries. Early detection and the availability of equitable and sustainable health services pave the way to breaking the chain of transmission.

Through health camps, VFAHT aspires to screen and vaccinate the masses against deadly infectious diseases. These camps also double back as a source of disseminating awareness about the disease and advocating preventive interventions.

Public Awareness

Public Awareness Campaigns aim at educating people through seminars, webinars, walks, social media, and door-to-door awareness programs. The components of these campaigns include Safe Blood Donation Seminars, Hand Hygiene Awareness Drives in schools, Hepatitis Awareness Campaigns, and awareness about other infectious diseases like Polio, Rabies, Malaria, Dengue, COVID-19, TB, HIV, Typhoid, and Oral Hygiene. We try to educate a maximum number of people about

the importance of treatment against infectious diseases and the basic preventive measures they can adopt to secure themselves.

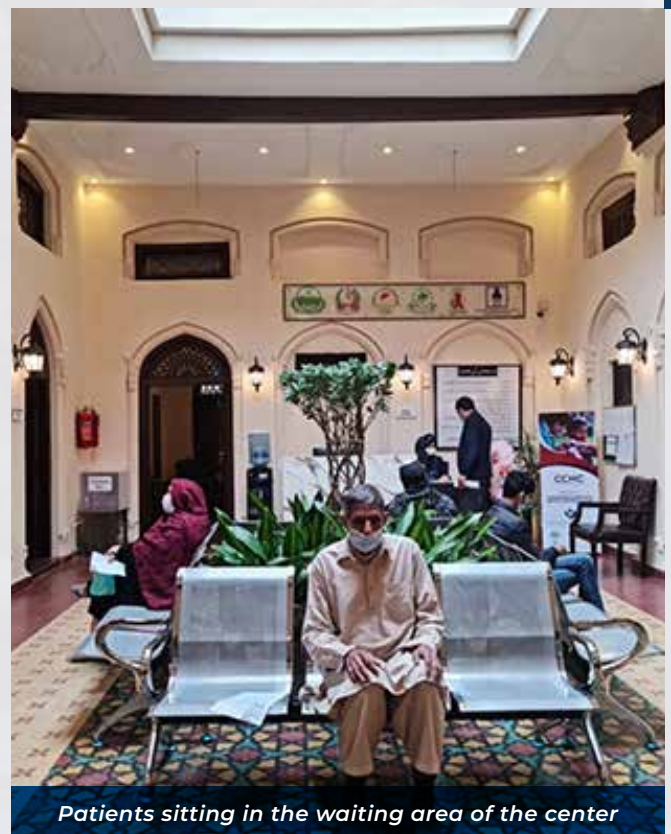
Hepatitis Clinic Lahore

Chiraghdin Community Health Centre

Chiraghdin Community Health Centre, over the span of one year, has established itself as one of the most trusted medical centers for the people of Sialkot and surrounding areas. The center has specialized clinics including Hepatitis, TB, VCCT, and Immunization Clinics. There is also a General Infectious Diseases Clinic, Diagnostic Lab, Pharmacy, and Women & Child Health Clinic. The clinic provides advanced quality services including free consultation from experienced and expert doctors, medicines, lab tests, and vaccinations for children and adults. The facility also houses a community hall that provides patient education and counseling regarding infectious diseases.

Hepatitis Clinic Lahore

The Hepatitis Clinic at Al-Mustafa Trust Medical Center Lahore is run by IPAC Foundation. The clinic was inaugurated in July 2022. It provides free-of-cost diagnostic and treatment facilities to patients against Hepatitis. Besides, the clinic also provides counseling regarding Hepatitis B & C. The clinic has been established to provide timely diagnosis and proper treatment to people as well as to break the chain of infection by educating them about the necessary prevention and precautionary measures.

is to be formed as a public limited company under the Companies Act, 2017, with the primary object *"To aid, assist, set up, maintain, administer and run hospitals, nursing homes, mother and child care centers, clinics, dispensaries, immunization and vaccination centers and places of medical aid, convalescent homes, family planning centers, x-ray clinics, radio therapy centers, pathological and clinical laboratories, blood banks, eye banks or other centers connected with the care of human body, both in urban and rural areas, specially infection prevention and control, and it (a) intends to apply its profits and income towards those objects and (b) prohibits the payment of any dividend or profit to its members (c) ensures that its objects and activities are not and shall not, at any time, be against the laws, public order, security, sovereignty and national interests of Pakistan.*

2. Now, therefore, in pursuance of section 42 of the Companies Act, 2017, the Commission is pleased to grant licence to the said Association and direct that it may be registered as a public limited company without addition of the words "Limited" or "(Guarantee) Limited" to its name.

3. This licence is granted for a period of three (3) years subject to other conditions as mentioned in the Association with Charitable and Not for Profit Objects Regulations, 2018 or any other additional condition(s) where mentioned overleaf.

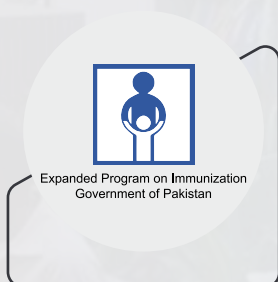
